University Hospital Lewisham does not have a problem with hand over times. Patients in ambulances arriving at our accident and emergency are transferred to the hospital either immediately or certainly within 5-10 minutes

of arrival. The hospital does not have a set target time for handovers, as it has not been an issue for Lewisham.
